2020 Census

Shaping Your Future

The 2020 census is now upon us. In mid-March, homes across the country

began receiving invitations to complete the 2020 Census. Once the invitation arrives, you should respond for your home in one of three ways: online, by phone, or by mail. However, if you have not received an invitation we encourage you to go to the website and complete the census. The 2020 Census s will provide a snapshot of our nation—who we are, where we live, and so much more.

The results of this once-a-decade count determine the number of seats each state has in the House of Representatives. They are also used to draw congressional and state legislative districts .

The results of the 2020 Census will help determine how hundreds of billions of dollars in federal funding flow into communities every year for the next decade. That funding shapes many different aspects of every community, no matter the size, no matter the location. Hospitals, fire departments, and other critical programs and services.

Think of your morning commute: Census results influence highway planning and construction, as well as grants for buses, subways, and other public transit systems.

Or think of your local schools: Census results help determine how money is allocated for the Head Start program and for grants that support teachers and special education and school lunch programs.

The list goes on, including programs to support rural areas, to restore wildlife, to prevent child abuse, to prepare for wildfires, and to provide housing assistance for older adults and state legislative districts.

Responding to the 2020 Census is easy. Everyone can play a part in ensuring a complete and accurate count in 2020.

Vector Mosquitos can cause people to become sick and they carry the West Nile Virus. Everyone needs to be vigilant by staying indoors and covered as much as they can during the dusk hours between 5—7:30 p.m. Try to keep any and all standing pools of water emptied as those are areas that mosquitos like to congregate.

If you enjoy summer activities on or near the area water ways, please help make it safer.

Vector Mosquitoes carry West Nile Virus and can transmit other dangerous infections.

All donations to ARDA go to mosquito control efforts. Mosquitos are most active at dusk.

Business licenses are required within the incorporated boundaries of the Town of Alpine. Business Licenses are valid from July 1st —June 3oth of each fiscal year. Business Licenses are up for renewal on June 3oth 2020. Renewal notices have been sent out for previous license holders.

Animal Licenses are required in the Town of Alpine. We have received several complaints about dogs roaming the town without owners present for voice command or physical restraint control. Please do not allow your dogs to roam freely through town and be sure to get your pets licensed if you live within the incorporated boundaries of the Town of Alpine.


