

BE COUNTED ~ THE 2020

Get ready to be counted; the 2020 Census will be here soon! Since our Town's fair share of sales taxes is directly related to the results of the census it is important that all of our residents properly document their primary residences when answering your census questionnaire. The current census rules for determining your primary residence are as follows.

 $\sqrt{}$ People who are away from their usual residence while on vacation or on a business trip on Census Day are counted at their usual residence.

 $\sqrt{\text{People}}$ who live at more than one residence during the year are counted at the

place where they live most of the time.

 $\sqrt{\text{People}}$ without a usual residence are counted where they are staying on Census day.

As you can see it is not where you are physically located on April 1st it is your primary residence is found. Please help us get an accurate count of the primary residents of our Town!! Be Counted!!

During the 2020 Census, the Census Bureau will never ask you for:

- •Your Social Security number.
- Anything on behalf of a political party.
- Money or donations.
- •Your bank or credit card account numbers.

LET YOUR WATER DRIP

The Town of Alpine recommends that when the weather is very cold outside, you let the cold water drip. The reason is that water may freeze in your water line. When all the water in your home is shut off, the water pressure in that line

may increase. As water in the supply line freezes, it expands pushing against all the water between the line and your home. This build up in pressure can increase enough to cause a pipe to burst or fracture at its weakest point. Adequately insulating pipes can help to mitigate or completely prevent your pipes from freezing.

Running water through the pipe, even at a trickle, helps prevent pipes from freezing. Even at the slightest drip it can provide pressure relief when needed. A dripping faucet does waste some water, so only pipes vulnerable to freezing (pipes that run through an unheated or unprotected space) should be left with the water flowing. Keep the thermostat set to the same temperature during both the day and at night.

SNOW REMOVAL No person shall park, place or leave any vehicle or trailer on any public street, alley or Town of Alpine right-of-way between the hours of 7:00 p.m.—7:00 a.m. during the months of Nov.—April. Be mindful of snow removal when setting your garbage out on Trash pick up days.

PLANNING & ZONING COMMISSION MEETINGS

Meetings are held on the 2^{nd} Tuesday of the month and will be held once a month through the end of April 2020. Application deadline is on Monday preceding the 2^{nd} Tuesday of the month by 4:00 PM.

<u>Please note</u> "No development or construction activity is permitted until all applicable development approvals are issued by the Town of Alpine in accordance with Part 2 of the Alpine Land Use and Development Code (LUDC). If a person commences building development or remodeling for which a permit is required with having first obtained a permit, they are in violation of the LUDC. Such person shall pay twice the fee for said permit, costs associated with the Town's investigation of the violation, any hearings to abate and including reasonable attorney, engineer, inspector and surveyor's fees. The payment of such fees shall not relieve the person from fully complying with the requirements of the LUDC, nor does it automatically secure the permit or preclude a violation for the given infraction.

COMMODE CONVERSATION



Did you know that the Town's 11-year-old Wastewater Treatment Plant does an incredible job of removing the pollutants from the wastewater and produces the cleanest effluent in the State?

The effluent (Dirty water that has been treated) flows into the Snake River/Palisades Reservoir with 99.9% of solids removed and 99% BOD (Biochemical Oxygen Demand) removal.

As more users connect to the System/Plant there are more and more maintenance costs and supervision required; grit removal in the headworks; needed replacement of membranes, pumps and motors are also required.

Please keep in mind Sanitary Sewer Service is for Residential or Commercial purposes only. Dumping of hazardous materials into the sewer system is **prohibited** and a violation of the terms and conditions of your service agreement.

Just remember your Toilet is not a trash can! When in doubt, remember the **3 P's** (Poop, Pee & Paper {toilet paper}) are the only things flushed down the toilet!


